2020 Letter from Board Secretary Cathy Burrell

The Sister Parish, Inc. Board and staff began January excited about the new year. Most of the Board participated in the Open Delegation in November 2019 and were energized by visiting the communities in El Salvador and Guatemala. Several 2020 delegations were being planned between our linkages in Central America and the United States. In February, Wallingford United Methodist Church visited Guarjila.

Then the world learned about COVID-19, a contagious respiratory illness quickly spreading across the world. The symptoms were similar to the flu but complications could cause more serious illnesses and even death. The World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a pandemic in March. Around the world, businesses shut down and people quarantined in an effort to stop the spread of COVID-19. Travel was restricted and delegation travel was cancelled.

Sister Parish, Inc. could no longer operate in its usual way. Many people in El Salvador and Guatemala could no longer work due to quarantines and lockdowns. The pandemic left communities already living in poverty at risk of more hunger and illness. The Board and staff made it a priority to help Sister Parish communities in need and created an emergency relief fund. Through the generosity of donors, over \$45,000 was raised. The Sister Parish emergency aid fundraiser provided every Sister Parish community with aid money to use as they defined their greatest need. The majority of funds disbursed were being used for food. In the absence of government aid, Sister Parish Inc.'s community leaders organized efforts to help their neighbors in providing food baskets to help families through these tough times.

Hurricanes Eta and Iota hit Central America in November. At least four Sister Parish communities were affected. Sister Parish was able to provide emergency aid to these communities because of the relief funds.

In addition to providing emergency relief, we needed to find ways to continue to grow our relationships between the north and south even through a global pandemic. We found ways to connect by transitioning to online communications. Partner communities shared Zoom Bible studies, committee meetings, and conversations about the impact of the pandemic. Sister Parish, Inc. also organized presentations by speakers from Central American communities. Speakers included Miriam López of CORDES in El Salvador, Dina Velásquez, President of the cooperative and community center UPAVIM in Guatemala, and Miriam Vásquez, a nurse in an urban clinic. We learned so much from these community leaders about their experiences.

The Board asked what more we could do to bring our communities together and carry out the mission of Sister Parish. Out of this conversation grew the



idea of a virtual delegation. Since we couldn't be together in delegations, we could be together virtually. We could build our relationships and stand in solidarity with our brothers and sisters in El Salvador and Guatemala in a new way. Our goals would be the same as in-person delegations—to share our cultures and faith, strengthen our relationships and to inspire action toward peace and justice. It was a labor of love by the Sister Parish Board, staff and communities to create a delegation experience that connected us. From November 15-21 our communities came together for live sessions, current event presentations, music videos, a cooking video and story time videos. Thirteen out of fourteen southern communities participated.

In spite of the pandemic, Sister Parish, Inc. continued to live out its mission of strengthening the relationships we facilitate. We came together this year, connecting in new ways. The bonds between our northern and southern communities are so strong that even a worldwide pandemic couldn't stop us from coming together to learn, laugh and share the love we have for one another.




