Linda Main, Sister Parish Inc. Board President in 2024, shares with us her experience while traveling on a delegation to their partner community UPAVIM. This experience is a glimpse into how important sistering releationships are and how rewarding it feels to be part of this beautiful family.



"This year, 2024, I was privileged to experience a mini delegation to my hermanimiento, UPAVIM. We went to some of the same places that I had been to before, yet I learned new things at each one. There were only three of us as delegates so instead of us staying with families, the three of us stayed in the apartments on the fourth floor of the UPAVIM building. Staying with a family enables you to learn about and develop a closeness with one family. Staying in the apartments allowed us to socialize with multiple people. We had meals together. Many members of UPAVIM stopped by to visit if they had a few minutes. One evening many of them stayed late and we all "hung out" together. We taught them how to make s'mores, shared stories, laughed, ate snacks and sang together. It was a beautiful time of comradery with multiple people. A slightly different version of developing solidarity that I believe was equally as successful as home visits. That is what it is all about!"




